President's Vision Tour

Kwan Jang Nim H.C. Hwang has been touring both nationally and internationally, personally sharing his vision of the future of the Soo Bahk Do Moo Duk Kwan Federation with each one of it's members. We can be proud of our 59-year history and the ancient tradition of our most basic tenets. During KJN's tour to date many have responded with ideas how to strengthen the foundation of our Art, ensure growth and thus the future of our Art. This is exactly what KJN desires -- to share the responsibility with all the members.

KJN has asked Stanley Odle (from Region 10), Joyce Tredeau SBN (from Region 5)

and Larry Greenberg SBN (from Region 1) to spearhead the National President's Vision Tour Committee (PVTC). This group gave a well-attended presentation at the National Championships in San Diego. The emphasis was on SHARING our SBD experiences, communicating the value of Moo Do in a highly visible manner.

Although humility is a key concept in our training, we can use action to demonstrate the values we practice. This is the Action aspect of our Moo Do philosophy. KJN spoke at the end of the discussion session saying, "Without sharing [the SBD experience] it might as well be meditation."

The Karate Center has its own PVT committee chaired by Lucy Cheever. This PVTC will accept any and all ideas and see that they are implemented. From training we know Moo Do is an action-based philosophy.

Here is an opportunity to take action. Adult and youth students and their families are encouraged to submit ideas for example: guest-speaking in the schools, stretching/ breathing programs for the elderly, volunteer positions filled by students, use of newspapers, cable t.v., etc. Use your imagination! Jot down your idea and submit it to the office.
